IIWCC OVERVIEW

The International Interprofessional Wound Care Course (IIWCC) is designed for wound care specialists with some wound care education and experience: physicians, nurses, and other allied health professionals in the wound care field and related industry.

The IIWCC is a 9-to-12-month course, offered in partnership with the University of Toronto. The objective is to provide a comprehensive educational experience for wound care specialists and to translate new knowledge into practice. **Participants will obtain a Certificate of Completion from Dalla Lana School of Public Health, University of Toronto upon successful completion of:**

- **Two mandatory Educational Sessions (3 days each)**
- **Fourteen self-study modules (9 required to complete: 5 faculty chosen and 4 student chosen)**
- **A selective related to the student's day-to-day activities that is presented to the class and faculty along with a submitted written report - demonstrates the translation of evidence to practice setting.**
- **Four Skills Workshops including 3 virtual platform sessions with faculty between educational sessions.**

Participants will:

- Assess and critically review wound care literature in key subject areas (Educational sessions and Modules)
- Integrate wound care principles into module answers and patient management sessions (practice simulation)
- Demonstrate the application of best practices by developing a Selective related to the learner's everyday activities/presented to the class
- Perform new skills requiring demonstration of competency

QUALIFICATIONS

Participants must have a health professional degree **OR** provide proof of a minimum of five years of relevant skin and wound care experience. A letter from an employer must be attached at time of application for those individuals without a degree. Participants not meeting these requirements are encouraged to explore Project ECHO Ontario Skin & Wound

Project ECHO Ontario Skin and Wound

(<https://wound.echoontario.ca/>) The Project ECHO model centres around weekly expert-led virtual sessions through Zoom, that bring together an interprofessional cohort of primary care doctors, nurses, and other clinicians.

The sessions, resources, and community of practice build capacity to provide specialized care. The aim is to move knowledge, not patients, and offload costs in Ontario's healthcare sector. The weekly 2-hour ECHO sessions are CME accredited and provided at no cost with a short didactic lecture and case-based learning. Spokes present their own patient cases for team discussion and comprehensive management plans developed as a group.

For Canadian registrants, there is an option for the University of Toronto/Queen's University: IIWCC Advanced Certificate for Wound Care, starting from 2023, upon successful completion of all the components of IIWCC (acceptable within a 3-year completion timeframe) and 2 cycles of ECHO sessions (16 sessions).
