IIWCC OVERVIEW

The International Interprofessional Wound Care Course (IIWCC) is designed for wound care specialists with some education and experience: physicians, nurses, and other health professionals in the wound care field and related industry.

The IIWCC is a 9 to 12 month course, offered in partnership with the University of Toronto. The objective is to provide a comprehensive educational experience for wound care specialists and to translate new knowledge into practice.

- **Two core (mandatory) Residential Weekends (4 days each)**
- **Fourteen self-study modules (9 required to complete)**
- **A selective related to course content interpreted/presented to class members and a written report that is translated to each student's day-to-day activities.**

Participants Will:

- Assess and critically review wound care literature in key subject areas (Residential Weekends and Modules)
- Integrate wound care principles into module answers and small group patient sessions (Residential Weekend)
- Demonstrate the application of best practices by developing a Selective related to the learner's everyday activities

QUALIFICATIONS

Participants must have a health professional degree **OR** provide proof of a minimum of five years of relevant skin and wound care experience. A letter from an employer must be attached at time of application.
